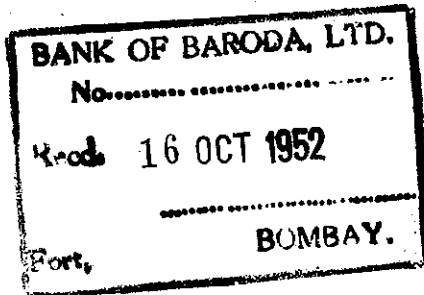

Dear Sir,

The Banking Companies Act, 1949.

With reference to your letter No.31/9739 dated the 8th June 1949 forwarding the application of the bank for a licence under section 22 of the Banking Companies Act, 1949, we enclose licence No.Bom.6 dated the 14th October 1952 authorising the bank to carry on banking business in India.

2. The licence or a certified copy thereof shall be kept displayed at the registered office of the bank from the date following the receipt of this letter.

3. If it is desired to indicate directly or indirectly in any advertisement that the permission of the Reserve Bank of India has been obtained for carrying on banking business, the following words shall be used:-

"A licence authorising the bank to carry on banking business has been obtained from the Reserve Bank of India in terms of section 22 of the Banking Companies Act, 1949. It must be distinctly understood, however, that in issuing the licence the Reserve Bank of India does not undertake any responsibility for the financial soundness of the bank."
